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1 In ancient Jewish tradition, there were SEVEN recognized gender categories, not just two.

➔ This includes:

- Zachar (male)
- Nekeivah (female)
- Androgynos (both)
- Tumtum (ambiguous)
- Saris (assigned male but lacks male traits)
- Ay'lonit (assigned female but lacks female traits)

..and more! Documented in the Talmud over 1,500 years ago! 🏛️📚

2 Jesus—yes, that Jesus—
acknowledges this diversity in
Matthew 19:12:

“Some are born eunuchs, some made
that way by others, and some choose it
for spiritual reasons.”

Translation: Not everyone fits the cis/
het mold, and that's OK. ✨

3 The prophet Isaiah (56:3-5)
drops a divine truth:

“To the eunuchs..I will give a name
better than sons and daughters.”



God sees you. God honors you. ✨

4 And in Acts 8, the first baptized convert outside Israel?

 A Black, gender-nonconforming Ethiopian eunuch reading Isaiah.

Philip says: “What’s stopping you from being baptized?”

Answer: NOTHING.  

 The Bible isn't just for cis, straight folks. It's been telling the stories of queer, gender-diverse people all along—you just weren't handed that translation. 

  Judaism and early Christianity had space for us. God always has.  

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
